Awards and Accolades

fter 35 years of being in service to vulnerable and at risk children and young people, Mary Jo's lifetime achievement has been recognised as she was awarded the Australian Allied Health Awards 2019 Social Worker of the Year. When interviewed and asked what her message would be to the allied health community, Mary Jo replied "When the weight of the work feels heavy and you stumble, lift your head up. Fix your gaze on a horizon that reminds you why you do this work and the people you serve. Then rise up with great joy and renewed enthusiasm."

In order to meet our organisational objectives to provide excellence in service to children and young people who have been abused, Cara House staff are supported to further their knowledge and education base in whichever manner sparks their interest. To this end, throughout 2019, two staff members underwent training intensives, and we would like to congratulate Manny Kassiotis who recently graduated from a 2 year Post Graduate Diploma in Bereavement Counselling for Children and Alys McLennan who graduated from a 350 hour yoga teacher training. Conferences and Keynotes

hroughout 2019, Mary Jo and the Cara House team were honoured to be invited to present at a wide number of industry conferences, both locally and abroad.

Some of the important topics that we shared with our peers included human rights, resilience, trauma informed care, child protection and epigenetics.

Cara House was represented internationally at a conference, when the Association of Children's Residential Centers invited Mary Jo to New Orleans to deliver the keynote speech at their international conference, where she spoke about a human rights framework for trauma intervention with children and young people. Mary Jo said of the experience "While New Orleans is far from Concord, in terms of the attendees and topics discussed the kilometers melted away. I got to hear and converse with many dedicated professionals who care as deeply for children and young people as we do at Cara. While we are a tiny organisation it is heartening to know we are part of a global network of caring professionals."

In addition, Mary Jo and Cara House facilitated our own human rights forums, providing information to our local community partners on human rights within Australian interventions.







araCare had another year of service to vulnerable children and young people with 106 referrals and 79 participants in our free group work programs. As CaraCare is able to continue its great work based solely on the generous donations from individuals and local community members, we will be hosting our first Ceilidh on March 28th at the Concord Community Centre. 






New Therapeutic Resource for Children
